# HOW Through on-the-ground, grass-roots efforts, we are transforming the river.



In 2014 FoRR adopted a one-mile stretch of the Swamp Rabbit Trail along the river from Faris Road to Woodland Way Circle, naming it the Woodland Way Corridor. Progress to date includes:

- The YMCA Spirit Center, an open-air classroom
- Construction of rain gardens at First Baptist Church Greenville and the YMCA
- Riverbank restoration on 200 yards at First **Baptist Church**
- A pollinator garden behind the YMCA

FoRR holds three river clean ups each year.

- 100 volunteers work on over 3 miles of the river at each clean up
- Hundreds of tires and other large objects are removed from the river
- 75+ bags of trash are collected
- Ongoing restoration projects
